Incoming Junior Course Request Worksheet

Completing this worksheet in advance will aid in the online registration process.

In order to request an Honors level course (H), all incoming juniors are required to meet the following criteria:

- 93 or above course average in 10th grade subject-related college prep course work or 84 or above course average in 10th grade subject-related honors level course work
- History of subject-area standardized test scores indicating success at the honors level
- Subject-area departmental recommendation addressing work ethic, classroom maturity, and skill level; the Guidance Office requests these recommendations from subject-area departments.

Honors English placement will be assigned by the end of June in plenty of time for summer reading completion. For Dual Enrollment (D.E.) requirements, please refer to the TCA Dual Enrollment information sheet in the online packet.

TCA DUAL ENROLLMENT – DETAILS, OFFERINGS, & ELIGIBILITY

- Enables eligible high school students to earn high school and college credits simultaneously for certain courses.
- Can help students accelerate educational goals, adapt to collegiate work gradually, increase the rigor of course offerings while in high school, and enter college with some degree requirements complete and recorded on an official collegiate transcript.
- Costs for DE courses vary and are less expensive than traditional college classes; financial aid through the Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant are available for eligible students.
- Classes are offered on campus and some online.

Promotion to Grades 10-12

- ★ For promotion to these grade levels, students can fail no more than two major subjects. Major subjects include Math, Science, English, and History. Any failed subjects will need to be remediated in summer school. All documentation pertaining to remediation must be given or emailed to the Guidance Office prior to beginning the next school year. Students failing more than two major subjects, will be required to repeat that grade.
- ★ For a student to receive full academic credit for a class at Trinity, a student's absences should not exceed ten (10) days in a semester unless an exception for extraordinary circumstances is made by the school's Attendance Committee which will require detailed documentation (i.e. physician, court, psychologist). All documentation is to be given or emailed to the Attendance Coordinator.
- ★ Any absence beyond ten (10) days in a semester and/or twenty (20) days for the school year will be recorded as unexcused without detailed documentation (i.e. physician, court, psychologist). All documentation is to be given or emailed to the Attendance Coordinator.
- ★ Students must pass the second semester of a year-long class in order to pass for the year.
