Incoming Sophomore Course Request Worksheet

Completing this worksheet in advance will aid in the online registration process.

In order to request an honors level course (H), all incoming sophomores are required to meet the following criteria:

- 93 or above course average in 9th grade subject related college prep course work or 84 or above course average in 9th grade subject related honors level course work
- History of subject-area standardized test scores indicating success at the honors level
- Subject-area departmental recommendation addressing work ethic, classroom maturity and skill level

Honors English placement will be assigned by the end of June in plenty of time for summer reading completion.

All sophomores must register for one of the following courses in each line item:

English 10 (1 credit) or English 10 H (1 credit)

Geometry (1 credit) or Geometry H (1 credit) or Algebra II (1 credit) or Algebra II H (1 credit)
(Choose either Algebra II class only if you had either Geometry class in 9th grade)

Biology (1 credit) or Biology H (1 credit) or Chemistry (1 credit) or Chemistry H (1 credit)
(Choose either Chemistry class only if you had either Biology class in 9th grade)

World History (1 credit) or World History H (1 credit)

Spanish I (1 credit) or Spanish II (1 credit) or Latin I (1 credit) or Latin II (1 credit)

Bible 10

- ❖ Enables eligible HS students to earn HS and college credits at the same time.

- ❖ These classes will be offered through Grand Canyon University. The cost for these classes will not be covered by the TN Dual Enrollment Grant. Cost is approximately \$300 per class, which includes the electronic resource fee.

Promotion to Grades 10-12

- ★ For promotion to these grade levels, students can fail no more than two major subjects. Major subjects include Math, Science, English, and History. Any failed subjects will need to be remediated in summer school. All documentation pertaining to remediation must be given or emailed to the Guidance Office prior to beginning the next school year. Students failing more than two major subjects, will be required to repeat that grade.
- ★ For a student to receive full academic credit for a class at Trinity, a student's absences should not exceed ten (10) days in a semester unless an exception for extraordinary circumstances is made by the school's Attendance Committee which will require detailed documentation (i.e. physician, court, psychologist). All documentation is to be given or emailed to the Attendance Coordinator.
- ★ Any absence beyond ten (10) days in a semester and/or twenty (20) days for the school year will be recorded as unexcused without detailed documentation (i.e. physician, court, psychologist). All documentation is to be given or emailed to the Attendance Coordinator.
- ★ Students must pass the second semester of a year-long class in order to pass for the year.
